Course Waiver Petition

The Graduate School does not allow coursework completed prior to enrollment at the Graduate School to be transferred. The Graduate School does, however, allow current Ph.D. students who, after completion of the Bachelor's degree, have completed graduate-level coursework to petition for the waiver of courses required by their Ph.D. program. Typically, up to three courses may be waived. Courses that are waived appear in the notes section of the student's Graduate School transcript without grades. Waived courses are not counted in determining a student eligibility for en route MA or MS degrees. A copy of the student's final official transcripts from the previous institution must be present in the student's Graduate School file for the petition to be evaluated.

Courses are not waived for students enrolled in terminal Masters programs. To avoid errors and delays, please complete the information section of this form electronically.
