COURSES

The Graduate School offers two courses, GSAS 901c and GSAS 902c, to support summer training through practical internships. Students will register for these courses as part of the internship approval process and not through the typical online or paper registration processes:

GSAS 901c Pre-Candidacy Applied Research Experience

Allegra di Bonaventura

The purpose of this course is to provide students with the opportunity to gain practical experience in research. This experience provides a basis for developing a dissertation thesis prospectus that addresses significant research questions. (1 credit; SAT/UNSAT).

GSAS 902c Post-Candidacy Applied Research Experience

Allegra di Bonaventura

The purpose of this course is to provide students with the opportunity to perform dissertation research or to gain practical experience using the methodology or results of their dissertation research. Prerequisite: completion of one year of the PhD program, admission to candidacy, and approvals from dissertation adviser and DGS (1 credit; SAT/UNSAT).

ALL STUDENTS

Please add to your calendar a reminder to e-mail to your DGS your post-internship report (usually in September) which should contain details of how your summer internship progressed and whether the aims of your internship were met (one page is fine). Your DGS should then grade your post-internship report as SAT or UNSAT and e-mail the grade to gsasadministrativedean@yale.edu so that it may be added to your transcript. Please follow-up with your DGS to ensure the grade is e-mailed.
